



1.2 Getting started

1.2.1 Setting up

Inserting or removing the SIM/microSD card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. You do not need to power off your phone before inserting or removing the SIM card as this phone supports hot swap.



Your phone only supports nano-SIM cards. Do not attempt to insert other SIM types such as a standard or micro card; otherwise this may cause damage to your phone.

Charging the battery

You are advised to fully charge the battery (). Charging status is indicated by how full the battery icon is displayed on screen. The battery icon will fill as the phone is charging.



There are a few ways you can reduce power consumption and energy waste when the battery is fully charged. Some examples include disconnecting your charger from the plug, switching off GPS, Bluetooth or other background-running applications while not in use, reducing the backlight time, etc.

1.2.2 Powering on your phone

Hold down the **End/Power** key until the phone powers on. Then, unlock your phone if necessary and confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

If you do not know your passcode or forgot it, contact your network operator. Be sure to write down your passcode and keep it in a secure place.

1.2.3 Powering off your phone

Press and hold the End/Power key until the screen turns off.

1.3 Home screen

Press the **End/Power** key until takes you back to the main Home screen.



1.3.1 Status bar

From the status bar, you can view both the phone status (on the right side) and notification information (on the left side).

1.3.2 Locking and unlocking your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the phone with a passcode.

To create a passcode

- From the Home screen, press the Center Soft key (∞) to open the applications list. Select the Settings icon () and then press the Navigation key to select Privacy & Security > Screen Lock. Select the On icon () to turn on passcode mode.
- Create and confirm the passcode.

• Press the **Right Soft** key — to confirm.

To lock phone screen

Close the phone to lock the screen.

To unlock the phone screen

Open the phone to light up the screen, and enter your password to unlock the screen.



1.3.3 Personalizing your Home screen

Wallpaper customization

From the Home screen, press the Center Soft key (∞) , select the Settings icon (o) and then press the Navigation Key to select Personalization.

Press the **Navigation** key and select **Display > Wallpaper**. Select the image location to browse from **Wallpaper**, **Gallery** or **Camera**.

Select a new image, and press the **Center Soft** key (rev) to save. When you exit to the Home screen, the new image will be displayed.

1.3.4 Volume adjustment

Using the volume key

Press the **Volume** key to adjust the volume. To activate vibrate mode, press the **Volume down** key until the phone vibrates.

Using the settings menu

You can set the ringer, media and phone ringtone volumes to your preference by pressing the Volume key, or pressing Settings > Personalization > Sound > Volume to set the volume.

2.1.1 Making a call

Dial the desired number then press the Call key $_$ to place the call. If you make a mistake, press the Back/Clear key \boxdot to delete the incorrect digits.



You can also make a call from your call log:

First, press the **Call** key \subseteq from the Home screen to access the call log and choose the contact you want to dial. Then, press the **Center Soft** key (\propto) to make the call.



If you want to make a call from **Contacts**, please select **Contacts** from app list. Choose the contact you want to dial, and then press the **Center Soft** key \bigcirc or the **Call** key \bigcirc to make the call.

To hang up the call, press the End/Power key ____.

International call

To dial an international call, long press $\underline{\mathbf{x}_{+}}$ to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number. Then, press the **Call** key \subseteq .

Emergency call

If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and press the **Call** key — to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the passcode.

2.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call:

- Press the Left Soft key or the Call key to answer;
- Press the the **Right Soft** key or the **End/Power** key _ **u** key to reject.

To mute an incoming call, press the Volume up/down key.

2.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to allow callers to leave messages. It works like an answering machine that you can access at any time.

To access your voicemail, press and hold the "1" key. To view your voicemail, go to the **Contacts** screen and select **Speed Dial**. Then, select **Voice Mail > Change Voice Mail Number**, and then you can edit the voicemail number.

Finally, press the **Right Soft** key \frown to save.

2.2 Call log


You can access your call log by pressing the **Call** key _____ from the Home screen or app list to view Missed calls, Outgoing calls and Incoming calls.

Select a contact or number and press the **Center Soft** key $\textcircled{\mbox{ev}}$ to launch a new call. Press the **Right Soft** key \frown to access a variety of options. You can view detailed information of the call, send a Message to the contact or number, or edit your call log.

2.3 Contacts

 $\ensuremath{\textit{Contacts}}$ enables quick and easy access to the contact you want to reach.

You can access this function by pressing the **Center Soft** key \bigcirc from the Home screen and selecting the **Contacts** icon \bigcirc .



2.3.1 Adding a contact

In the contacts list screen, press the Left Soft key — to add a New Contact. Here, you can add and edit the new contact's information.

To exit without saving, you can press the Left Soft key \frown and then press the Right Soft key \frown to discard changes.

2.3.2 Editing your contacts

In a contact detail screen, press the Right Soft key \frown to access Options, select Edit, and press the Center Soft Key $\textcircled{\mbox{\ o}}$ to edit.



When finished, press the **Right Soft** key \frown to save.

2.3.3 Deleting a contact

In a contact detail screen, press the **Right Soft** key \frown to access **Options**, select **Delete**, and press the **Center Soft** key \frown to delete.



2.3.4 Sharing your contacts

You can share a single contact with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Messages or Bluetooth.

Select a contact you want to share, press the Right Soft key \fbox to access Options, and then select Share.

Special letters or characters (such as accented letters) will also increase the size of the text message. If the text message goes over the character limit, multiple SMS may be sent to your recipient.

Sending a multimedia message

• MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, and contacts by pressing the **Right Soft** key
to other compatible phones.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, photo, etc.) are attached.

3.2 How to type a message

When in edit mode, the default input method is English. You can press the keypad to change the input method to access numerical characters (1, 2, 3, etc.), or long press the corresponding key to get the number you want.

- You can enter text using predictive text input. To set your desired text input, please select Settings > Personalization > Input Methods.
- For normal text input, press a number key, 2-9, repeatedly until the desired character is displayed. If the next letter you want is located on the same key as the present one, wait until the next cursor is displayed.
- Press **• key to switch among "abc-->ABC-->123-->Abc" mode.
- To insert a punctuation mark or special character, please press **K** key.
- If you want to delete the already typed letters or symbols please press Back/Clear key to delete them one by one.

3.3 Adjust message settings

The message settings menu lets you control options for your text and MMS messages.

On the Messages screen, press the Right Soft key $\fbox{}>$ Settings. You can set the following:

- Auto Retrieve Messages
 Select this option to automatically retrieve all your multimedia messages completely. When selected, the multimedia message header plus the message body and attachments will automatically download to your phone. If you turn this option off, only the multimedia message header will be retrieved and shown in your Messaging screen.
- WAP Push Press to enter WAP push options.
- Emergency Alerts Press to enter Emergency alerts options.

4 Calendar, Alarm, and Calculator

4.1 Calendar.....

Use the ${\ensuremath{\textbf{Calendar}}}$ to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To access this function, press the Center Soft key () from the Home screen and select Calendar.

You can display the Calendar by Schedule, Day, Week, or Month.

4.1.2 To create new events

Press the Left Soft key 🦳 to add new events from any Calendar view.

- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select **All-day Event**.
- When finished, press the **Right Soft** key to save.
- More options are available by pressing the **Right Soft** key from the Calendar main screen:
- Go to date To go to a specific date.
- Search Search the event or schedule you added on the Calendar.
- Settings To set a series of Calendar settings.

4.1.3 To delete or edit an event

To delete or edit an event, select the event and press the **Center Soft** key or to enter its details screen. Then, press the **Left Soft** key \fbox{or} to delete the event, and press the **Right Soft** key \fbox{or} to edit.

4.1.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon \blacksquare will appear on the Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

4.2 Alarm

Your cellphone has a built-in alarm.

To access this function, press the Center Soft $\text{key} \boxdot$ from the Home screen and select Alarm.

4.2.1 Alarm

To set an alarm

From the Clock screen, press the Left Soft key — to to add a new alarm. The following options will appear:

• Time	Press to set the alarm time.
• Repeat	Select the days you want your alarm to go off.
• Sound	Select a ringtone for the alarm.
• Vibrate	Press to activate vibration.
Alarm name	Press to enter a name for the alarm.

To adjust alarm settings

More options are available by pressing the **Right Soft** key — from the Clock screen:

٠	Edit	Press to edit alarm.
•	Delete	Press to delete alarm.
•	Settings	Press to set snooze time, volume, vibration and sound.

4.2.2 Timer

From the Alarm screen, press the right side of the Center Soft $\ker(\boxdot)$ to enter the Timer screen.

- Press the **Navigation** key to edit the hour, minute and second. When you are finished, press the **Center Soft** key (a) to start timer.
- Press the **Center Soft** key 💌 to stop the timer.
- Press the **Center Soft** key 💌 again to restart the timer.

- Press the Right Soft key when the timer starts to add 1 minute.
- Press the Left Soft key to reset the timer on the halt screen.

4.2.3 Stopwatch

From the Timer screen, press the right side of the Center Soft key \bigcirc to enter the Stopwatch screen.

- Press the Center Soft key $\textcircled{\mbox{\scriptsize ex}}$ to start the stopwatch.
- Press the **Center Soft** key 💌 to halt the total times.
- Press the **Right Soft** key to record the lap.
- Press the **Center Soft** key 💌 to restart.
- Press the Left Soft key to reset the stopwatch on the halt screen.

4.3 Calculator.....

With the Calculator, you can solve many mathematical problems.

To access this function, press the Center Soft key $\textcircled{\mbox{\ \ o}}$ from the Home screen and select Calculator.



Enter a number and the arithmetic operation to be performed. Then, enter the second number and press "=" to display the result.

5 Multimedia applications

5.1 Camera......

Your cellphone is fitted with a Camera and a Camcorder for taking photos and shooting videos.

Before using the Camera or Camcorder, be sure to remove the protective lens cover to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

To access this function, press the Center Soft $\text{key} \boxdot$ from the Home screen and select Camera.



To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. Position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, and press the **Center Soft Key** ($\textcircled{\mbox{o}}$) or **Camera Key** on the right side of the phone to take the picture which will be automatically saved.

Before taking a picture, you can adjust a number of settings.

Zoom in/out Viewfinder

• Press the up or down side of the **Navigation** key to zoom in and out the viewfinder.

Press the Right Soft key \frown to access:

Selftimer	Set the timer to take a picture after pressing the capture button.
• Grid	This divides the screen into equal parts and helps you take better photos by making it simple to align compositional elements to the grid, such as the horizon or buildings.
Gallery	Go to the Gallery application.
• Modes	Go to photo mode or video mode.

After taking a picture, press the **Left Soft** key — to preview.

To shoot a video

Press the right side of the **Navigation** key to switch to Video mode from Camera mode.

- Press the Center Soft Key 💌 or Camera Key to shoot a video.
- After you finish recording, press the Center Soft Key (a) or Camera Key again to save. You can go to the Video app to play the video.


Before shooting a video, you can adjust:

- Zoom in/out Press the up or down side of the Navigation Viewfinder key to zoom in and out the viewfinder.
- Video options Press the Right Soft key
 to enter Video settings.



You can view your photos in the Gallery app. You can also access additional photo options here.

To access this function, press the Center Soft $\text{key}(\textcircled{\sim})$ from the Home screen and select Gallery.



Working with pictures



You can work with pictures by rotating or cropping them, sharing them with friends, setting them as a contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Delete	Delete the selected picture.
• Edit	Select this option to adjust exposure value, rotate the picture, crop, add filters and auto-correction.
• Rename	Rename the selected picture.
• Rotate	Rotate the picture.
• Share	Share the picture via Messages or Bluetooth.
• File Info	View the picture information, such as name, size, image type etc.
• Lock	After the picture is locked, you cannot delete, edit, rename or rotate this picture until it's unlocked.
Set as	Set the selected picture as a Wallpaper or existing contact image.
Sort and Group	This option enables you to sort pictures by date and time, name, size etc. and group by date.

5.3 Video.....

To access this function, press the Center Soft Key $\textcircled{\mbox{\ \ o}}$ from the Home screen and select Video.

When accessing this feature, you can play, share, and delete any videos saved onto the phone.

5.4 FM Radio

Your phone is equipped with a radio⁽¹⁾ with RDS⁽²⁾ functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels, or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you tune to stations that offer Visual Radio service.

To access this function, press the Center Soft key () from the Home screen and select FM Radio.



To use it, you must plug in your headset, which works as an antenna connected with your phone.



- ⁽¹⁾ The quality of the radio depends on the coverage of the radio station in that particular area.
- ⁽²⁾ Depending on your network operator and market.

Press the left/right side of Center Soft key $\textcircled{\sc original}$ to decrease/increase by 0.1MHz.

Long press the left/right side of **Center Soft** key \bigcirc to search and go to the nearest lower/higher frequency channel.

To add a channel as a favorite, press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options**, and select **Add to Favorites**. The channel will be added in the channel list with a red star next to it. You can also press the **Right Soft Key** to edit your favorite channels or switch to speakerphone.



To access this function, press the ${\bf Center}\; {\bf Soft}\; {\rm key} \, \textcircled{\mbox{\ only}}$ from the Home screen and select ${\bf Settings}.$

6.1 Network & Connectivity

6.1.1 Airplane Mode

When Airplane mode is on, it will simultaneously disable all wireless connections including mobile data, Bluetooth and more.

6.1.2 Cellular Settings

Carrier

When a nano-SIM card is inserted, the phone will detect the service provider automatically.

Enhanced LTE Services

Mark the checkbox to enhance LTE services.

6.1.3 Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) within a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).

6.1.4 Calling Settings

DTMF tones

Dual Tone Multi-Frequency, or DTMF is a method for instructing a telephone switching system of the telephone number to be dialed, or to issue commands to switching systems or related telephony equipment.

Press to set DTMF tones to normal or long.

Call Waiting

Press to activate or deactivate call waiting.

Caller ID

Press to select network default, hide number or show number.

Call Forwarding

Press to configure how your calls are forwarded when you are busy or unreachable.

Call Duration

Press to view your call durations.

6.1.5 Messaging Settings

Auto Retrieve

Press to disable auto-retrieve or enable auto retrieve with/without roaming.

WAP Push

Mark the checkbox to enable receipt of push messages from network.

Service Center

It shows the service center number.

6.1.6 Emergency Alerts

Alert Inbox

Press to view Alert messages in the alert box.

Emergency Alert Sound

Mark the checkbox to enable emergency alert sound.

Emergency Alert Vibrate

Mark the checkbox to enable emergency alert vibrate.

Multi Language Support

Mark the checkbox to enable multi language support.

Presidential alert

Mark the checkbox to enable presidential alert.

Extreme alert

Mark the checkbox to enable extreme alert.

Severe alert

Mark the checkbox to enable severe alert.

AMBER alert

Mark the checkbox to enable AMBER alert.

6.2 Personalization

6.2.1 Sound

Volume

Press to set volume for Media, Ringtones & notifications and alarm.

Tones

Press to manage tones.

Other Sounds

Press to enable/disable the sound for the dial pad, camera and sent message.

6.2.2 Display

- Wallpaper Press to select an image to use as phone wallpaper from the wallpaper, gallery or camera.
- Brightness Press to set the level of brightness.
- Screen Timeout Press to set screen timeout.

6.2.3 Notices

Show on lock screen

Press to enable or disable notices shown on the lock screen.

Show after reboot

Press to enable or disable notices shown after rebooting.

6.2.4 Date & Time

Date

You will only be able to adjust the phone's date manually if you disable auto sync.

Time

You will only be able to adjust the phone's time manually if you disable auto sync.

Time Zone

You will only be able to adjust the phone's time zone manually if you disable auto sync.

Time Format

Press to select 12-hour or 24-hour clock format.

Clocks

Press to enable the Home screen clock.

6.2.5 Language

Press to select the language and the region you want.

6.2.6 Input Methods

Press to select input languages.

6.2.7 Answer Mode

Press to enable flip to answer.

6.3 Privacy & Security

6.3.1 Screen Lock

Screen lock allows you to set a 4-digit password which secures your phone from intrusions. Whoever turns on your phone will be prompted to enter a password in order to access your device.

6.3.2 SIM Security

A SIM PIN prevents access to the SIM card cellular data networks. When it's enabled, any device containing the SIM card will request the PIN upon restart. A SIM PIN is not the same as the lock code used to unlock the device.

6.4 Storage

6.4.1 USB storage

Enabling USB storage allows another computer or device connected using USB to access files on this phone.

6.4.2 End user storage

Use these settings to monitor the total and available space on your phone.

6.5 Device

6.5.1 Device Information

This contains information about the device such as the Model number, Software version, Hardware, Legal information etc.

6.5.2 Battery

Press to set power saving mode.

Turning on the power saving mode will turn off the phone's data, Bluetooth and Geolocation connections to extend battery life.

You can also adjust power use via the screen brightness or screen timeout settings in the Display screen settings.

6.5.3 Accessibility

Invert Colors

Press to turn on/off color inversion.

Backlight

Press to turn on/off backlight.

Large Text

Enable large text to enlarge the screen text.

Captions

Press to activate/deactivate captions for the phone screen.

Readout

Readout mode function reads labels of interface elements and provides sound response.

Mono Audio

Press to turn on/off mono audio.

Volume Balance

Press to set the volume balance value.

Keypad Vibration

Press to activate/deactivate keypad vibration.

TTY

TTY mode can be used by people who are deaf, have poor hearing or speech impairments.

Press to set TTY to full, VCO, HCO or turn off TTY.

Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC)

Hearing aid mode can be used by people who are deaf, have poor hearing or speech impairments. After connecting the phone and hearing aid device, calls are linked to a relay service, which converts incoming speech to text for the person using the hearing aid and converts outgoing text from the hearing aid device to a spoken voice for the person on the other end of the conversation.

7 Making the most of your phone.....

You can update your phone's software by using the Over the air Upgrade tool.

To access Update phone, select Settings > Device > Device Information > Update phone > Update Firmware. If you want to update the system, select Download. After it is done downloading, select Install to complete the upgrade. Now your phone's software will be the latest version.

You should turn on data connection before searching for updates. Settings for auto-check intervals is also available once you restart the phone.

If you have chosen auto-check, the system will alert you if there is a new version. A dialog will pop up, and you can choose to download or ignore. The notification will also appear in the status bar.

9 Troubleshooting.....

Before contacting the service center, you are advised to follow the instructions below:

- You are advised to fully charge (
) the battery for optimal operation.
- Avoid storing large amounts of data in your phone as this may affect its performance.
- Use the FOTA (Firmware Over The Air) Upgrade tool to update your phone's software. To access Update phone, press Settings\Device\ Device Information\Update phone\Update Firmware.

My phone can't be switched on

• Check the battery power level. If you cannot see the power level, charge for at least 20 minutes.

My phone has not responded for several minutes

- Restart your phone by pressing and holding the End/Power key.
- If your phone has a removable battery, remove the battery and reinsert it, then restart the phone.

My phone turns off by itself

- When your phone turns off by itself, make sure that the End/Power key is not accidentally pressed.
- Check the battery charge level.

My phone can't charge properly

- Make sure that you are using the proper charger that comes with the phone.
- If your phone has a removable battery, make sure that your battery is inserted properly and the battery terminal makes a good contact with the phone. It must be inserted before plugging in the charger.

- Make sure that your battery is not completely discharged; if the battery power has been discharged for a long time, it may take around 20 minutes to display the battery charging indicator on the screen.
- Make sure that charging is carried out under normal conditions (0°C (32°F) to 45°C (113°F).
- When abroad, check that the voltage input is compatible.

My phone can't connect to a network or "No service" is displayed

- Try connecting to the network by moving to another physical location.
- Verify the network coverage with your carrier in your current area.
- Check with your carrier that your SIM card is valid.
- Make sure your phone's setting is not in airplane mode.

My phone can't connect to the internet

- Make sure that Cellular Data internet service is available in your wireless service plan.
- Make sure that you are in a place with network coverage for cellular data.
- Try connecting at a later time or another location.

Invalid SIM card

- Make sure that the SIM card has been correctly inserted.
- Make sure that the chip on your SIM card is not damaged.
- Make sure that the service of your SIM card matches the network you're on.

My phone can't make outgoing calls

- Make sure that you have dialed a valid number and have pressed on your phone.
- For international calls, check the country and area codes.
- Make sure that your phone is connected to a network, and the network is not overloaded or unavailable.
- Check your subscription status with your carrier.

- Make sure that you have not barred outgoing calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in airplane mode.

My phone can't receive incoming calls

- Make sure that your phone is switched on and connected to a network. Check for an overloaded or unavailable network.
- Check your subscription status with your carrier.
- Make sure that you have not forwarded incoming calls.
- Make sure that you have not barred certain calls.
- Make sure that your phone is not in airplane mode.

The caller's name/number doesn't appear when a call is received

- Check that you have subscribed to this service with your carrier.
- Your caller may have concealed their name or number.

I can't find my contacts

- Make sure that your SIM card is not broken.
- Make sure that your SIM card is inserted properly.
- Import all contacts stored in the SIM card to the phone.

The sound quality of the calls is poor

- Adjust the volume during a call by pressing the Volume up/down key.
- Check the network strength. Move to a location with a stronger signal strength.
- Make sure that the receiver, connector or speaker on your phone is clean.

I can't use the features described in the manual

- Check with your carrier to make sure that your subscription includes this service.
- Make sure that this feature doesn't require an additional accessory.

When I select a number from my contacts, the number can't be dialed

• Make sure that you have correctly recorded the number in your file.

• Make sure that you have selected the country code when calling an international number.

I can't add a contact

• Make sure that your SIM card contact list is not full; delete some files or save the files to the phone.

My callers can't leave messages on my voicemail

- Contact your network carrier to check service availability.
- Set up your voicemail with your carrier, so that your caller can leave a message.

I can't access my voicemail

- Make sure that your carrier's voicemail number is correctly entered in "Voice Mail Number".
- Try again later if the network is busy.

I can't send and receive MMS

- Check your phone memory as it might be full.
- Contact your network carrier to check service availability and MMS parameters.
- Verify the server center number or your MMS profile with your carrier.
- The server center may be busy. Try again later.
- Start a new Messaging string. You messaging string may have reached its limit.

SIM card PIN locked

• Contact your network carrier to obtain the PUK (Personal Unblocking Key) code.

The phone can't be detected by others via Bluetooth

- Make sure that Bluetooth is turned on and your phone is visible to other users.
- Make sure that the two devices are within Bluetooth's detection range.

The battery drains too fast

- Make sure that you follow the complete charge time (minimum 100 minutes).
- Adjust the brightness of screen as appropriate.
- Deactivate Bluetooth or GPS when not in use.

The phone doesn't ring when a call or message arrives

• Press the Volume up/down key to adjust volume.

I forget some passwords/codes/keys on phone

• Perform a Factory Reset.
